FREE Sneak Preview of *Looking for Lincoln* documentary

Join Colorado Humanities for a Free Sneak Preview of the new *Looking for Lincoln* documentary on **Tuesday, February 10, 7 to 9 p.m.**, at the University of Denver.

Celebrate Abraham Lincoln's 200th birthday in February and attend a sneak preview of *Looking for Lincoln*, a new PBS documentary exploring the life, legacy, and legend of the president often remembered as America's "Great Emancipator." In the film, Harvard Professor Henry Louis Gates Jr. explores how the Lincoln legend grew out of controversy, greed, love, clashing political perspectives, power struggles, and considerable disagreement over how our 16th president should be remembered. His quest to piece together Lincoln's complex life takes him from Illinois to Gettysburg to Washington, D. C., and face-to-face with people who live with Lincoln every day – relic hunters, re-enactors, and others for whom the study of Lincoln is a passion.

The preview will be followed by a panel discussion with Colorado State Historian Bill Convery, University of Denver professor and Abraham Lincoln scholar, Dr. Susan Schulten, and University of Colorado Afroamerican Studies professor, Dr. William M. King on Lincoln's legacy in our times.

The screening will take place in Davis Auditorium on the second floor of Sturm Hall, 2000 East Asbury in Denver. **Admission is free and seating is limited.** Doors open at 6:30 p.m. Call 303-866-4686 for more information.
